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Dr. Kinney earned a Ph.D. in epidemiology with a minor in behavioral science from the University of Texas School of Public Health-Houston and completed an NCI-Funded R25T postdoctoral fellowship in cancer control and epidemiology at the Lineberger Comprehensive Cancer Center at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She has been an actively funded NIH investigator in the area of cancer prevention for over two decades with a focus on health disparities, cancer survivorship, and behavioral, social, and care delivery genetics research. Dr. Kinney's research brings a combination of behavioral science, clinical, and epidemiologic perspectives to address unsolved cancer control problems in diverse populations and settings. The overarching goal of her research is to understand variation in cancer risk; determinants of risk and outcomes; and to use this information to develop effective interventions that facilitate informed decision-making, positive changes in health behaviors, and guideline-concordant care delivery that leads to better outcomes. Much of her research has focused on documenting determinants of interest, access and use of genomic tests and related health services in diverse populations, and using this information to better understand and address health disparities. She also has considerable experience leading and collaborating on large community-based and population-based randomized trials that have developed and implemented effective interventions to promote cancer risk assessment and screening in average-risk and high-risk populations and appropriate translation of genetic discoveries into clinical practice as well as improve health outcomes in cancer survivors. In addition, Dr. Kinney has extensive experience in both service- and research-oriented community outreach and engagement and currently leads a state-wide cancer control program, ScreenNJ.

Dr. Kinney has been an active member of ASPO since 1995 and has served the organization in several leadership roles, initially serving on the Junior Members Organizing Committee and as an abstract reviewer. Subsequent ASPO leadership roles include Conference Chair (2010), Director at Large, Chair of the Nominating Committee, and Chair of the Survivorship SIG Committee. She is currently a Senior Editor of *Cancer Epidemiology, Biomarkers and Prevention*.
