

Ramzi Salloum, PhD is a Professor and the Division Director for Implementation Science and Health Interventions in the Department of Health Outcomes and Biomedical Informatics at the University of Florida College of Medicine. Dr. Salloum serves as the Associate Director for Community Outreach and Engagement with the University of Florida Health Cancer Center and as the Director of the Learning Health System Program at the UF Clinical and Translational Science Institute. Dr. Salloum's work considers the dissemination and implementation of evidence-based practices across the cancer care continuum, with a particular focus on tobacco control, both in the United States and in global settings. His research has been funded by the National Institutes of Health, the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute, and the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality. He has authored more than 200 peer-reviewed publications. He has served as PI of several large implementation trials and is currently leading the evaluation of sustainability for the Cancer Center Cessation Initiative across 52 NCI-Designated Cancer Centers. Dr. Salloum has been an invited faculty member in NCI's Training in Dissemination and Implementation Research in Cancer (TIDIRC) and serves as a member of the State of Florida Cancer Control and Research Advisory Council.

Dr. Salloum joined ASPO as a post-doctoral trainee in 2012, and since then, has actively contributed to ASPO's mission. He served as Vice Chair (2017-2019) and Chair (2019-2021) of the Global Cancer Research SIG and has worked to advance an implementation science agenda in global cancer research. He has also served as a poster judge at several annual meetings. As Secretary-Treasurer of ASPO, Dr. Salloum would work closely with the Executive Director to prepare the budget and present financial documents to the membership at the Annual Meeting and would play an important role in the dissemination of scientific information for the Society.
