

T-32 Postdoctoral Program in Cancer Prevention and Control

Now accepting applications for 2019

The NCI-funded T-32 Training Program in Cancer Prevention and Control at the Wake Forest Baptist Comprehensive Cancer Center is now seeking outstanding postdoctoral candidates for 2019.

Our program prepares trainees to become independent researchers in the field of cancer prevention and control with a particular focus on cancer survivorship, healthy lifestyles, and cancer care delivery. Program mentors have funded research in a wide range of relevant areas including health-related quality of life, lifestyle/behavior change (including tobacco, alcohol, diet, and physical activity), symptom management, access to treatment, health disparities, complementary and alternative interventions, late effects of cancer, and clinical care. Other key resources are provided by our Clinical and Translational Science Institute and NCI-funded Community Oncology Research Program (NCORP) Research base.

The program offers:

- Two to three years of funding
- Competitive salary
- Tuition support
- Health insurance
- Travel allowances
- Research support
- Opportunities for publications from existing data
- Optional MS degree or certificate in Clinical & Population Translational Sciences

This innovative postdoctoral program is highly tailored to the trainee and involves closely mentored training by a multi-disciplinary team of senior faculty representing various disciplines. The program provides didactic and experiential training in grant preparation, project management, data analysis and manuscript writing. Support is provided for conference travel, tuition, pilot studies, and other training related activities.

Eligibility

The Program seeks individuals with recent doctorates (PhD, DrPH, MD, DO) in health-related areas as well as experienced individuals wishing to more fully develop their research in cancer prevention and control. To be eligible, you must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.

Application Requirements

- Cover letter including a statement of research interests and how the training grant will further your career in cancer prevention and control
- Curriculum vitae
- 3 letters of recommendation
